In this his second book since the present war began, Mr. Pritt exposes the growing danger created by attempts to bring about war between Britain and the U.S.S.R. and seeks to rouse public opinion in order to prevent such an extension of hostilities which would involve incalculable misery.

In the course of his study he deals fully with recent events in Finland.



Howard Coster D. N. Pritt, K.C., M.P.

was born in 1887 and educated in England, Switzerland, Germany and Spain. In 1909 he was called to the Bar, and is now Labour M.P. for North Hammersmith and also Chairman of the Society for Cultural Relations with the U.S.SR. He was President of the Reichstag Fire Enquiry held in London in September, 1933. A year before, he visited the U.S.S.R., and in 1936 he attended the Moscow Trials and published a pamphlet, The *Zinoviev Trial*, on them. He is the author of *Light on* Moscow, and part author of *Twelve Studies* in Soviet Russia, published in 1933. Mr. Pritt is married, and has one son and one daughter.
