

The Struggle of the Native People Against Canadian and American Imperialism

The Native people of the Canadian north are a colonized people. Their history is the history of resistance, both active and passive, to the attempts of colonialism and imperialism to annihilate them as a distinct people. Through this struggle against their genocide, the Native people are welding themselves into a nation, with the right to political secession. These and other questions pertaining to the struggle of the Native colony for liberation from the yoke of imperialism are the subject of the article in this book.

The Canadian working class and progressive people must understand the importance of this question for the proletarian revolution in Canada, for as long as they are participating in the exploitation of another people, they can not be free themselves. They must understand the revolutionary role which a national revolutionary movement in the Native colony could play in advancing the proletarian revolution in the south of Canada. Above all, they must understand that the liberation of the Native people must be the accomplishment of the Native people themselves.
